

Mewar University has always encouraged young minds to come forward and play a vital role in shaping up the future of this country.


In this context, Mewar University organized Science Fair and Quiz Competition for school students on 10th October, 2018.

The competition was open for class IX – XII. Approx 200students participated in the quiz competition from 19 schools from Chittorgarh and Bhilwara district.



A Report on Martyr's Day (Shaheed Diwas) 23rd March, 2018 Organized by: Department of Civil Engineering Mewar University




Major Outcomes of Event:
