BETWEEN

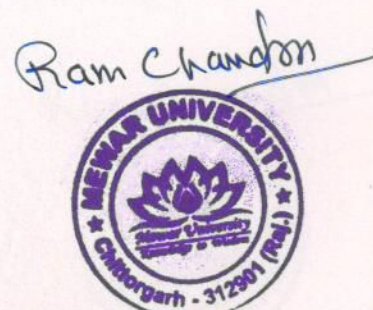
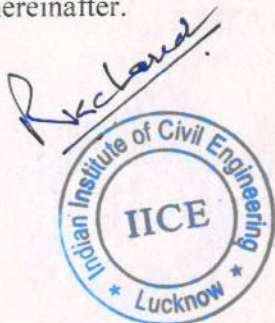
Indian Institute of Civil Engineering (IICE), Lucknow is having its office at Lucknow. Since last few years, developments in infrastructure have been quite significant in our country. The demand for qualified specialized civil engineers is increasing day by day. There are several sub-disciplines in civil engineering, where specialized short & long term programmes are required. Indian Institute of Civil Engineering (IICE) was established to identify, design & conduct specialized civil engineering programmes and to act as a catalyst between Industry & Academia, to provide specialized human resources to industry. Indian Institute of Civil Engineering is established, incorporated & licensed by MCA, Govt. of India under section 25 of Co. Act. IICE is also conducting research for generating knowledge to accelerate the process of skill development in the field of construction technology.

IICE is represented by Dr. R.K. Chaudhary, Director which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context hereof, mean its managers, successors and assignees hereinafter referred to as FIRST PART.

AND

Mewar University (MU), Gangrar, Chittorgarh (Rajasthan). Mewar University is an autonomous body promulgated by the Government of Rajasthan through Act No. 4 of 2009, passed by Rajasthan Assembly. The University is further approved by the UGC u/s 2(f) of the UGC Act 1956, with the right to confer degree u/s 22(1) of the UGC Act. Mewar University is promoted by the Mewar Education Society (MES) headed by Chairperson Shri Ashok Kumar Gadiya. It is controlled by a Board of Management, constituted by the MES and represented by its Chairperson CA Ashok Kumar Gadiya, which expression shall unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof include its successors and permitted assignees of the SECOND PART.

WHEREAS both " Mewar University " and "IICE", reckoning their complementing strengths and capabilities for vocational training, mutually agree to join hands and work together for fulfillment of their respective obligations on the terms and conditions described hereinafter.



1. OBJECTIVE OF THE "MOU":

The very objective of this "MOU" is to pool the respective strengths, resources, expertise and goodwill of both the parties to the "MOU" for the purpose of creating employability of the youth by imparting need based vocational training as and when required. The programmes required by the industry will also be offered.

2. PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAMME:

- To develop professional human resource for various academic programmes as approved by the parties to this "MOU".
- To develop new academic programmes and launch jointly for the benefit of the larger section of the society.

3. TERM of MoU

The "MoU" is initially for a period of five years from the date of signing and can be extended for further period(s) on the terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed to between the parties hereto.

4. Indian Institute of Civil Engineering (IICE), Lucknow

In consideration whereof IICE agrees to the following:

- To share academic expertise and course curriculum with the University
- To provide training to the students (4-6 weeks) in the relevant areas.
- Will issue training certificates to the successful candidates.

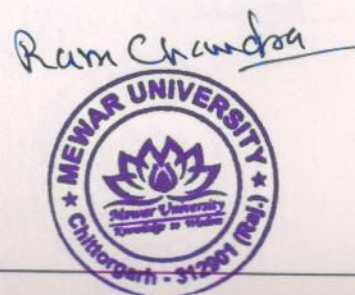
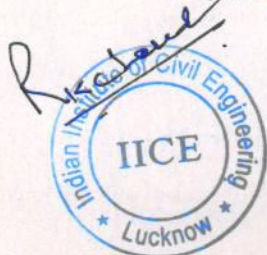
5. Mewar University

- a) Will provide infrastructural support for conducting the programme.
- b) Will deploy its professionally qualified and trained staff for the conduct of programmes.
- c) Shall launch jointly the academic programmes as mentioned in Annexure-1.
- d) Shall pay to IICE as mentioned in Annexure-1.

6. WARRANTIES & REPRESENTATIONS

Each Party warrants and represents to the other Party that the following warranties and representations are true as of the date of this MOU (except for matters disclosed to the other Party in writing prior to said date):

- It is willing to enter into this MOU and to perform the transactions to be consummated or performed by it hereunder.
- It has no outstanding commitments, liabilities or obligations, contractual or otherwise, which would in any way conflict with or impede its ability and right to enter into this MOU or fulfill any and all of the obligations hereunder, or to conduct the activities contemplated hereby;



- It is not in violation of or in default of any provision of its Memorandum of Understanding or Rules and Regulation or any MOU to which it is a Party or of which it has knowledge.
- It is not subject to any existing, pending or threatened litigation or other proceedings which would materially affect the Activities.
- It is not subject to any existing, pending or threatened insolvency or bankruptcy, and has not explicitly or implicitly suspended payments of any debt as they become due (except debts contested in good faith).
- There is no material error or omission in any representation and warranty as set forth in this Clause.
- It has obtained all statutory or regulatory approvals from concerned authorities as may be required and appropriate in connection with this MOU or for carrying out of the Activities stated therein.
- It is not empowered to act, incur, assume or create any debt, liability or obligation on behalf of the other Party.

Each Party ("Warrantor") agrees to indemnify and hold the other Party harmless from any and all liabilities (direct or indirect), losses, costs, damages, finder's fee, commission and expenses, including attorneys' fee and costs of litigation or arbitration, which the other Party may sustain by reason of a Warrantor's breach of any of the representations and warranties, as set forth in this clause..

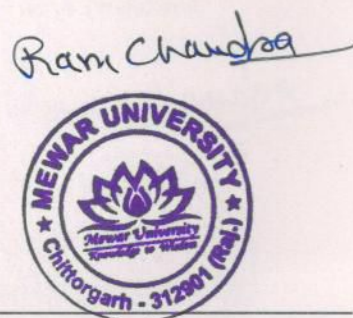
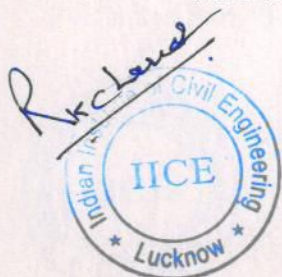
7. INITIAL TERM AND ITS RENEWAL

This MOU shall commence from the date of signing of this MOU and unless terminated by mutual MOU or pursuant to Clause 8 herein below, shall remain in force from the date of signing till the termination of the term of five years.

Provided the Parties to the MOU may, one month prior to the expiry of the MOU renew the MOU for an additional period of one year or more on the existing or amended terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed upon between the parties hereto.

8. TERMINATION

- (i) Notwithstanding the foregoing, this MOU may be terminated forthwith by any Party upon the sending of notice in writing upon the occurrence of one or more of the following events:
- a. if the other Party shall commit a breach of any of its obligations under this MOU, and shall fail to remedy within 15 days from the date written notice is sent to such Party requiring that such breach be remedied;
 - b. if the other Party shall become incapable for a period of three (3) months of performing any of its obligations under this MOU because of any unforeseen event;
 - c. if the other Party becomes insolvent or incapable of performing its duties under this MOU.



- (ii) The MOU may be terminated by either Party at any time by giving a three months notice in writing to the other Party.

9. CONSEQUENCES OF EXPIRY OF TERM OR TERMINATION OF MOU

- a. Immediately on the expiry of the term or extended term(s) or termination of the MOU, the right of the both the parties to use the marks and logos of the each other shall stand totally withdrawn.
- b. Termination of this MOU shall be without prejudice to the rights and liabilities accrued of the Parties to the MOU at the date of termination, unless waived in writing by the mutual MOU of the Parties.

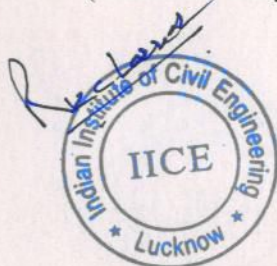
10. DISPUTES RESOLUTION & ARBITRATION

- a. If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever arises between the Parties in connection with the MOU including any question regarding its existence, validity or termination, the Parties shall seek to resolve any such dispute or difference by mutual consultation.
- b. If the Parties fail to resolve such dispute or difference by mutual consultation, then either Party may give to the other Party formal notice in writing that the dispute of difference exists, specifying its nature, the point(s) in issue and its intention to refer the dispute to arbitration.
- c. If the Parties fail to resolve such dispute or difference by further consultation within a period of thirty (30) days from the date upon which such notice of dispute has been given, the dispute or difference shall be referred to and finally settled by arbitration.
- d. It is agreed between the Parties that in such event the arbitration shall be conducted in accordance with the Indian Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996. The venue of the Arbitration shall be New Delhi and the language of Arbitration proceeding shall be English.
- e. That it is agreed between the parties that in such event the concerned dispute may be referred by either party to the sole Arbitrator to be appointed jointly by the Competent Authority, IICE and the Chairperson, Mewar University or any other person appointed by them.
- f. The award of the arbitrator(s) shall be final and binding on the Parties.

11. FORCE MAJEURE EVENT

Any failure or delay of a Party to perform any obligation under this MOU solely by reason of acts of God, government acts, riots, wars, strikes, lockouts or other causes beyond its control (a "Force Majeure Event") shall not be deemed to be a breach of this MOU provided, however, that the Party so prevented from complying shall continue to take all actions within its power to comply as fully as possible with the provisions of this MOU. Performance of this MOU shall resume as soon as practicable after such Force Majeure Event has come to an end or has ceased to exist.

Except where the nature of the Force Majeure Event shall prevent it from doing so, the Party prevented from performing its obligations due to such Force Majeure Event ("Affected Party") shall notify the other Party in writing within seven (7) days or earlier,



if reasonable, after the occurrence of such Force Majeure Event of its occurrence and estimated duration. The Affected Party shall in every instance, to the extent it is capable of doing so, use its best efforts to remove or remedy the cause of such Force Majeure Event with all reasonable dispatch. Upon cessation of a Force Majeure Event, the Affected Party shall give prompt notice in writing to the other Party of such cessation.

12. MISCELLANEOUS

(a) Amendments to this "M.O.U"

No amendments, changes, alterations or modifications to this MOU shall be effective unless in writing and signed by both the Parties and, if required, upon approval by the competent authorities of each Party.

(b) Implementation and Observation of this MOU

Each Party undertakes to carry out this MOU in good faith and to respect the spirit as well as the letter of its provisions.

(d) Non Waiver

Failure of any Party hereto to insist upon the strict and punctual performance of any provision hereof shall not constitute waiver of, or estoppels against, asserting the right to require such performance, nor should a waiver or estoppels in one case constitute a waiver or estoppels with respect to a later breach whether of similar nature or otherwise.

(e) Disclaimer of Agency

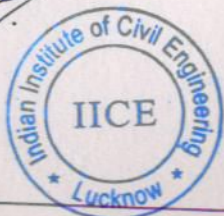
This MOU shall not be deemed to constitute any Party hereto the agent or partner of the other Party and nothing in this MOU or in the performance by the parties of their obligations/responsibilities shall be construed so as to create any partnership or association of persons.

(f) Assignability

This MOU and each and every covenant, term and condition hereof shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Parties hereto and their respective successors and legal assigns, but neither this MOU nor any rights or obligations hereunder shall be assignable directly or indirectly by any Party hereto without the prior written consent of the other Parties, provided that before this MOU is so assigned the assignee, shall execute an MOU to be bound by this MOU in the same manner as the assignor.

(g) Severability

In the event that any of the provisions or portions of this MOU are held to be unenforceable or invalid by any duly constituted arbitral panel or Court of competent jurisdiction, the Parties shall negotiate an equitable adjustment in the provisions of this MOU with a view toward effecting the purpose of this MOU, and the validity and enforceability of the remaining provisions or portions shall not be affected thereby.

Mewar University is having its main campus at NH- 79 Gangrar, Chittorgarh (Rajasthan) and camp office at Sector 4C, Vasundhara (Ghaziabad). Mewar University is an autonomous body promulgated by the Government of Rajasthan through Act No. 4 of 2009 and passed the Rajasthan Assembly. The University is further approved by the UGC under u/s 2(f) of the UGC Act 1956.

This Memorandum of Understanding entered into on 14th December, 2012 between the Mewar University, an Institution, imparting and offering educational courses hereinafter referred to as ("Mewar University") –located at Gangrar, Chittorgarh, Rajasthan and represented by CA Ashok Kumar Gadiya, Chairperson of the University, which expression shall unless repugnant to the context means and include its successors and assigns of the ONE PART. Wherever the word University comes in this MOU, it implies Mewar University.

Indian Institute of Sugarcane Research (IISR), Lucknow is having its office at Indian Institute of Sugarcane Research, Raibareli Road, P.O. Dilkusha, Lucknow - 226 002.

IISR, Lucknow was established in 1952 by the erstwhile Indian Central Sugarcane Committee for conducting research on fundamental and applied aspects of sugarcane culture as well as to coordinate the research work done on this crop in different states of the country. The Government of India took over the Institute from the Indian Central Sugarcane Committee on 1st January, 1954. It was transferred to the Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR), New Delhi on April 1, 1969. The Institute is located in Lucknow, the capital city of Uttar Pradesh and conveniently situated at about 12 kms from CCS Amausi Airport and about 5 kms each from Lucknow Railway Station and Alambagh Bus Station. The mandate of the Institute approved by the ICAR is as follows:

1. To conduct basic and applied research on all aspects of production and protection techniques of sugarcane and other sugar crops particularly sugar beet for different agro climatic zones of the country.
2. To work on the breeding of varieties for subtropical region in close collaboration with Sugarcane Breeding Institute, Coimbatore.
3. To carry out research for diversification and value addition in sugarcane.
4. To develop linkages with State Agricultural Universities, Research Centres and other organizations for collaborative research, exchange of information and material, and
5. To provide training, and consultancy to end users at regional, national and international levels.

IISR is represented herein by Dr Sushil Solomon, Director (hereinafter referred to as "IISR" which expression shall unless repugnant to the context means and include its successors and assigns of the OTHER PART.

WHEREAS

The University and IISR Lucknow have decided to collaborate for various academic activities.

1. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE IISR

The IISR (Indian Institute of Sugarcane Research, Lucknow) will facilitate the following:

- (i) B. Sc. (Ag), B. Sc. (Home Science), B Tech., M.Sc. (Ag), M Tech. and Ph.D students registering with the University will be allowed to carry out their research project pertaining to sugarcane and other sugar crops at IISR, Lucknow as per the requirements and approved plan of work.
- (ii) Periodic training (summer or winter) as required for fulfillment of course work under different programmes of the University at nominal charges by the Institute from time to time.



- (iii) Periodical meetings of the students supervisors either at the premises of ICAR Institute or University.

2. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE MEWAR UNIVERSITY

3. GENERAL

- a. Benefits such as improved technology, material, machinery, process, designs and techniques, accruing or arising from this effort may be used by either or both the parties with due recognition of each party's contribution.
- b. Results from collaborative research may be used by either or both the parties with due recognition of each party's contribution.
- c. Research findings as a result of this collaborative work of both the parties will be published in the public interest.
- d. Research findings published by either party will give due credit to others party's contribution, but the publishing party shall be entirely responsible for conclusions and interpretations reported.
- e. During the study period at both the Institutes, the head of the University/ Institute will be the Controlling authority and candidate shall be bound to get permission to leave the place of work from the Controlling authority.

4. VALIDITY OF MOU

This agreement will be in effect initially for a period of ten years from the date of signing this MOU by both the parties and renewed further if mutually agreed.

Either party may terminate the agreement by written notification signed by the appropriate official of the institution initiating the notice. Such notice must be received by the other party six months prior to the effective termination date.

However, obligations and commitments already contracted shall be honored and continued by both the parties until such commitments are cover.

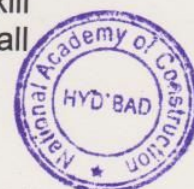



The Finishing School Programme

With a view to meet the immediate trained human resource requirements of the Civil Engineers in Industrial and Infrastructure Projects, it is proposed to set up a Internship programme for engineering undergraduates who have completed 5th & 7th Semester.

NAC, the institute will train undergraduates of 50 / 60 each batch for 3 Calendar Month program. Minimum Records that are Part Of Internship Program are :

1. Reports:

There are various types of reports: Practical, field-work, laboratory, technical etc. Generally, report is a systematic and well-organized document that defines and analyzes a subject or a problem. For example, Engineering Internship students are trained to write a progress or technical report as part of their internship assessment.

2. Portfolio:

Portfolio is a compilation of documentation of a student's past achievements. In the context of internship/placement, portfolio often includes students' major pieces of work, feedback from their supervisor/industrial tutor, and their own reflective analysis.

A complete and well organized portfolio can show a student's development and learning progress in internship/placement. Entries include written reflections and documentary media such as photographs, diagrams, videos, audio files etc., as evidence of their internship experience.

3. Logbook:

LogBook contains a record or proof of a student's learning accomplishments, learning experience, and learning outcomes. Students can include their logbooks in their CV for future, job seeking purposes.

This requires students to keep a daily work log for their internship program. Students must provide details of their internship including:

- Day and time of activities;
- Goal(s) and objective(s);
- Activities and duties performed;
- Reactions and comments from their supervisor/industrial tutor.

4. Reflective Journal:

Reflective journal is a written series of students' ideas, personal thoughts, experiences, reflections, and insights gained during and after their internship/placement. It provides a record of students' internship/placement activities.

Entries are entered chronologically with date and number of hours worked recorded. The learning journal also contains the industrial supervisor's/ tutor's feedback and suggestions regarding the internship.

The proposed internship at NAC, Hyderabad for Undergraduates

1. The proposed internship at NAC, Hyderabad for undergraduates is in batches of 50 / 60 each for a period of 90 calendar days, with a well defined Quality Assurance (QA) frame work in line with defined objective of National Skills Qualification Frame work (NSQF).



Record Note of the meeting between Officials of Office of DC (MSME) and Mewar University for organising Training Programmes for students and faculty members of Mewar University at MSME Tool Rooms.

In response to Mewar University letter No. MU/MSME/2012/ dated November 19, 2012 addressed to Additional Secretary & Development Commissioner (MSME), Ministry of MSME, Government of India, a proposal for conducting training programmes for students and faculty members of Mewar University was prepared in consultation with MSME Tool Rooms concerned and forwarded to Mewar University.

As desired by AS&DC, a meeting was held in the Office of DC (MSME) on December 19, 2012 to finalise various modalities.

The following officials were present:

2. Mr. R.K. Rai, Director (Tool Room), O/o DC (MSME)
3. Shri. Ashok Kumar Gadiya, Chancellor, Mewar University

5. Ms. Kanika Rai, Assistant Director, Mewar University
6. Shri C.S.S Rao, Dy. Director (Tool Room), O/o DC (MSME)
7. Shri Charanjeet Singh, Assistant Director (Tool Room), O/o DC (MSME)

The following are the recommendations of the committee.

1. Faculty Orientation Programme (Item No. 1):

One week orientation programmes for Mewar University faculty members may be made available for 7 training programmes at Tool Rooms (Aurangabad, Ahmedabad, Indore, Hyderabad, Mumbai, Ramnagar). The fee is Rs.10000/- per candidate inclusive of boarding & lodging.

Mewar University welcomed the proposal and agreed.

2. Training Programmes for Students

(i) Mechanical (Tool Design/CAD/CAM/CAE) (Item No. 2)

There are seven training programmes. 3 courses are of 6 weeks duration and 4 are of 4 weeks duration. The fee of the programmes is Rs.20,000 for 6 weeks and Rs.15,000 for 4 weeks. The corresponding boarding and lodging charges are Rs.6000/- and Rs.4000/- per student.

The batch size has to be a minimum of 20 students.

Mewar University welcomed the proposal and requested MSME to reconsider the training fee because Mewar University is largely catering to SC/ST/OBS students. The MSME considered the request of Mewar University and agreed for the fee of Rs.18,000 and Rs.12,000 for 6 and 4 weeks programmes respectively.

(ii) Electronics (PCB Design/VLSI/PLC & MC Programming/Embedded System/SACDA) (Item No. 3)

There are nine training programmes. One programme is of 6 weeks duration and 8 programmes are of 4 weeks duration. The fee of the programmes is Rs.20,000 for 6 weeks and Rs.15,000 for 4 weeks. The corresponding boarding and lodging charges are Rs.6,000/- and Rs.4,000/- per student. The batch size has to be a minimum of 20 students.

Mewar University welcomed the proposal and requested MSME to reconsider the training fee because Mewar University is largely catering to SC/ST/OBS students. The MSME considered the request of Mewar University and agreed for the fee of Rs.18,000 and Rs.12,000 for 6 and 4 weeks programmes respectively.

(iii) Software (Programming and Testing) (Item No. 4)

There are three training programmes. 2 programmes are of 4 weeks duration and 1 programme is of 6 weeks duration. The fee of the programmes is Rs.20,000 for 6 weeks and Rs.15,000 for 4 weeks. The corresponding boarding and lodging charges are Rs.6,000/- and Rs.4,000/- per student. The batch size has to be a minimum of 20 students.

Mewar University welcomed the proposal and requested MSME to reconsider the training fee because Mewar University is largely catering to SC/ST/OBS students. The MSME considered the request of Mewar University and agreed for the fee of Rs.18,000 and Rs.12,000 for 6 and 4 weeks programmes respectively.

(iv) Automation (Pneumatics/Hydraulic/Electrical/Electronics) (Item No. 5)

There are three training programmes, all of 4 weeks duration. The fee of the programmes is Rs.15,000. The corresponding boarding and lodging charges are Rs.4,000/- per student. The batch size has to be a minimum of 20 students.

Mewar University welcomed the proposal and requested MSME to reconsider the training fee because Mewar University is largely catering to SC/ST/OBC students. The MSME considered the request of Mewar University and agreed for the fee of Rs.12,000 for 4 weeks programme.

(v) Animation (Real Animation and Multimedia Techniques / Graphic Design) (Item No. 6)

There are two training programmes, one of 6 weeks and other for 4 weeks duration. The fee of the programmes is Rs.20,000/- and Rs.15,000 respectively. The corresponding boarding and lodging charges are Rs.6,000/- and Rs.4,000/- per student. The batch size has to be a minimum of 20 students.

Mewar University welcomed the proposal and requested MSME to reconsider the training fee because Mewar University is largely catering to SC/ST/OBS students. The MSME considered the request of Mewar University and agreed for the fee of Rs.12,000 for 4 weeks programme and Rs.18,000 for 6 weeks programme.

The MU and CUZ wish to collaborate with ZAMCOM for offering Post Graduate Research Integrated (PGRI) Programmes in "Journalism & Electronic Media Communication", training

programmes and other joint academic programmes of mutual interest. The details of the programme are given in Annexure -1.

1.0 CONDUCT OF PROGRAMMES

1.1 **Admission Procedure:** The admissions for the programme will be done by the MU and CUZ in close collaboration with ZAMCOM.

1.2 **Delivery of the Programmes:** The University will do teaching with the active involvement of ZAMCOM. However, the practical component/training will be done at the ZAMCOM Campus. The University will pay to ZAMCOM as per the details given in Annexure 1.

2.0 RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE MEWAR UNIVERSITY AND CAVENDISH UNIVERSITY ZAMBIA

- 2.1 The University shall be responsible for all administrative work relating to registration, enrolment, and conduct of examinations and award of Degrees.
- 2.2 The University shall monitor the quality of the programmes.

3.0 RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE ZAMCOM

- 3.1 ZAMCOM will provide training in the area of editing, reporting, script writing, anchoring, exposure to camera and its handling, voice over and diction clarity, news coordination and news management, video editing and imparting basic knowledge of studio and associated equipments.
- 3.2 ZAMCOM will conduct practical training and help the University in industrial attachment for the same and placement through campus selection of the students.

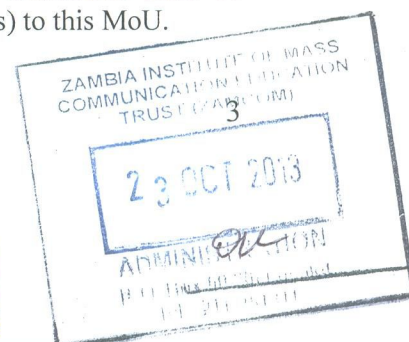
4.0 JOINT RESPONSIBILITIES

- 4.1 Any expansion or modification relating to the academic programmes shall be decided jointly by the University and ZAMCOM.
- 4.2 Any legal implications will be confined to Lusaka Jurisdiction only.

5.0 OTHER TERMS & CONDITIONS

- 5.1 **VALIDITY:** This MoU shall come to effect upon signing of this Agreement/MoU and shall remain valid for a period of SIX (6) Years and may be renewed further on mutual consent of all the PARTIES in writing.
- 5.2 **TERMINATION:** This MoU can be terminated by either PARTY with a three (3) months' notice for the violation of any of the terms and conditions under this MoU/Agreement. However, if the MoU is terminated for whatsoever reason, the responsibility of each PARTY shall continue to exist till the completion of the Programmes to which the students have been admitted prior to the date of servicing the Notice of Termination.
- 5.3 **AMENDMENT:** The obligations of ZAMCOM, Mewar University and CUZ have been outlined in the MoU. However, during the operation of MoU, circumstances may arise which may call for alterations of modifications of this Agreement. These alterations shall be mutually discussed and agreed upon in writing and added as Addendum(s) to this MoU.

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- 5.4 **MATTER NOT PROVIDED IN THE AGREEMENT:** If any doubt arises as to the interpretation of the provision herein, or pertaining to matters not provided hereunder, PARTIES to this MoU shall consult with each other for each instance and resolve such doubts in good faith. The 'Board of Studies' consisting the representatives of all the PARTIES, shall be a joint body governing of this MoU and shall be responsible for addressing all such issues.
- 5.5 **FORCE MAJEURE:** Neither Mewar University nor CUZ nor ZAMCOM shall be liable to each other or to their students for their respective failure or delay in the performance of any of its obligations under the Agreement if and only if such failure or delay is caused by riots; civil commotions; war hostilities between nations; government imposed laws, orders, regulations and embargoes; Acts of God; storms, fires, accidents, strikes, sabotages, explosions or other contingencies at ZAMCOM and/or Mewar University/CUZ beyond the reasonable control of the respective PARTIES.
- 5.6 **SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTE AND JURISDICTION:** If dispute or differences of any kind arise between PARTIES in connection with or arising out of this Agreement or MoU, the PARTIES shall resolve them within a period of two-months in the first instance by mutual discussion. If the dispute cannot be settled within the two-month period as provided herein, the PARTIES can approach the competent Courts at Lusaka to adjudicate upon the matter.
- 5.7 **NO PARTNERSHIP:** This Agreement has been entered upon between Mewar University, CUZ and ZAMCOM for the sole purposes stated herein and no Clause under this Agreement shall be deemed to constitute any business relationship such as Association/Society; Trust; or Joint-Venture Company etc.
- 5.8 **REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES:** The PARTIES hereby represent and warrant to each other:
- 5.8.1 That each PARTY is duly established and existing under the Laws of Jurisdiction stated against its name in this Agreement and has the power and authority to sign this Agreement and implement the terms and conditions of the MoU agreed to herein.
- 5.8.2 That each PARTY has the requisite legal power and authority to enter into this Agreement, and to perform & comply with its respective duties and obligations under this Agreement and the MoU.
- 5.8.3 That this Agreement constitutes legal, valid and binding obligations on part of both PARTIES enforceable in accordance with the terms hereof.
- 5.8.4 That the execution, delivery and performance of this Agreement have been duly authorized by all requisite actions and will not constitute a violation of (i) any Statute, Judgment, Order, Decree or Regulation of any Court; Government Instrumentality or Arbitrary Tribunal applicable or relating to itself, its assets or its functions or (ii) of any other documents or to the best of its knowledge any Indenture, Contract or Agreement to which either of the PARTIES may be bound.
- 5.8.5 That no representation or warranty made herein contains any untrue statement.
- 5.9 **INDEMNIFICATION:** Both the PARTIES shall indemnify and keep the other Party indemnified and harmless against any and all claims, actions, proceedings etc. (including all costs, expenses, damage/losses arising thereof) arising out of, or in connection with, this Agreement due to breach of any provisions of this Agreement by either PARTY or as a result

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


of any act of negligence, omission or commission on part of either PARTY and/or its employees, agents etc.



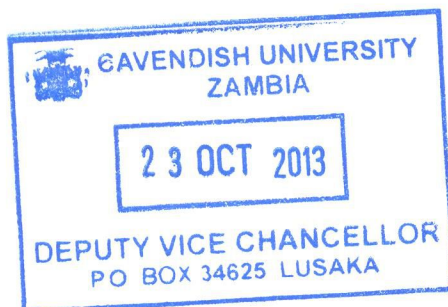

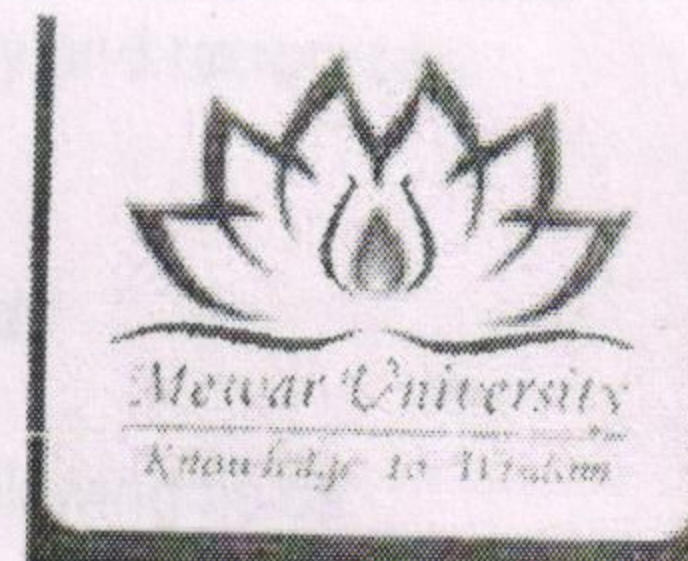

L'Université de Nantes et Mewar University, conscientes de l'intérêt d'établir des partenariats internationaux pour le développement de leur institution respective, mettent en place cet accord de coopération.

Chaque université s'engage à mettre en place cet accord en respectant les lois et réglementations en vigueur dans chaque pays et après consultation et approbation des deux parties.

Vu le décret n° 85-1124 du 21 octobre 1985 relatif à la coopération internationale des établissements publics d'enseignement supérieur relevant du ministère français de l'Education ;

Vu le décret n°2005-450 du 11 mai 2005 relatif à la délivrance de diplômes en partenariat international,

Les cosignataires, Monsieur le Professeur Olivier Laboux, Président de l'Université de Nantes, d'une part,

et

Monsieur le Professeur Ashok Kumar Gadiya, Président de Mewar University, d'autre part,

s'engagent à ce que les institutions qu'ils représentent légalement respectent le présent accord selon les clauses des articles suivants :

Université de Nantes and Mewar University, recognizing the benefits of the establishment of international agreements for their institutions, decide to sign this Memorandum of Understanding (MoU).

Both universities agree to carry out this MOU in accordance with the laws and regulations of their respective countries, after full consultation and approval of both partners.

In respect of French decree no. 85-1124 signed on October, 21, 1985, relating to international co-operation by public higher education establishments under the auspices of the French minister of Education;

In respect of French decree n°2005-450 signed on May, 11, 2005 relating to the delivery of diplomas in international partnerships.

The two universities respectively represented by, Professor Olivier Laboux, President of University of Nantes,

and

Dr. Ashok Kumar Gadiya, Chairperson of Mewar University,

hereby confirm their commitment to respect this agreement according to the following terms:

Ashok Kumar Gadiya

Article 1 – Objet de l'accord

L'Université de Nantes et Mewar University, s'accordent pour réaliser des actions de développement de programmes d'intérêt commun dans l'enseignement et la recherche, dans un esprit d'égalité et de réciprocité.

Article 2 – Champs de coopération

Cet accord concernera :

- a) l'échange d'étudiants selon le principe de réciprocité,
- b) l'élaboration et la réalisation de thèmes communs de recherche, incluant la possibilité de cotutelle de thèse dont les conditions de réalisation sont précisées dans une convention individuelle de cotutelle,
- c) l'organisation de programme de master commun et études doctorales,
- d) l'échange de spécialistes pour des périodes à définir à des fins de recherches scientifiques communes,
- e) la recherche de support pour les projets d'intérêt commun aux deux parties,
- f) l'organisation commune de conférences et de séminaires,

Article 3 – Disciplines concernées

- c) consider the organizing of joint Master Programmes and Doctoral Studies,
- d) exchange of faculty for periods to be defined in order to conduct common researches,
- e) Seek support for projects determined to be mutually beneficial to both institutions,
- f) conducting lectures and organising symposia,
- g) exchange of academic information and scientific and research materials,
- h) sharing of expertise and initiatives in the interest of both institutions, for the promotion of collaboration in fields of mutual interest.

Article 3 – academic fields included in the MoU

The faculty involved for Université de Nantes is:

- o Polytech Nantes

The fields concerned are all fields in common between Polytech Nantes and Mewar University.

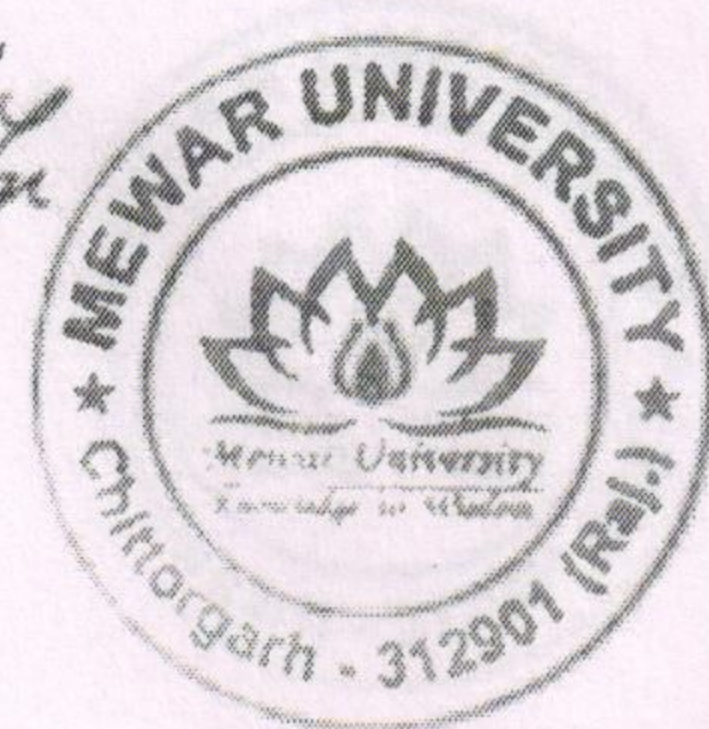
Any other academic field/faculty can be added by an addendum to the present agreement.

Article 5 – Échange d'étudiants

Article 7 – Propriété Intellectuelle

Article 5 – Student exchanges

Students to be exchanged are nominated by their home institution and shall be in good academic standing and have completed at least one year of their program of study and possess sufficient language skills to participate successfully in the exchange program.

Students will pay university fees at their home institution. The exchange will lead to the earning of credits only.

Exchanges are subject to the approval of the relevant course/program coordinator.

Students will have the same privileges provided to full-time students of the host institution while they are on the exchange and will be required to abide by the rules and regulations of the host institution.

The host university through its International Office commits to provide useful information to incoming exchange students and to assist them upon their arrival in adjusting to university life by providing services and information on orientation, registration, housing, social security and home language courses.

Article 6 - Confidentiality

Each party undertakes not to publish or disclose in any manner whatsoever scientific or technical information belonging to the other party which has been received in the execution of the present contract without prior written consent of the other party. This obligation shall apply as long as such information has not become public property. This commitment shall remain in force during 5 years from the date of signature of this contract, notwithstanding the termination or expiry date of the latter.

Article 7 – Intellectual Property

Confidential information shared by a party remains its exclusive property. The sharing of such confidential information can in no way be considered or construed as conferring any property rights or patent licence.

Article 8 – Moyens financiers

Les parties conviennent que la mise en œuvre du présent accord dépend de la disponibilité des ressources et de l'apport financier des universités concernées. Article 8 – Resources

It is understood that the implementation of the MOU shall depend upon the availability of resources and financial support at the universities concerned. Both institutions will endeavour to obtain financial means from their own budget, or that of other institutions or agencies in order to meet the costs arising from these exchanges.

Specific addenda to this MoU can be drawn annually. These specific agreements will include the details of the actions and provisional budgets to be submitted to the approval of each institution.

Article 9 – Duration and termination of the MoU

The present agreement is valid for a period of five years from the date of signing by the representatives of both universities. This MoU may be amended or modified by a written agreement signed by the representatives of both Universities. It may be renewed on the same terms, or on such terms as may be agreed by the two institutions.

This MoU may, at any time during its period of validity, be terminated by one of the Universities upon prior notice to the other in writing not later than six months before the termination date, without prejudice to the activities under way.

Two original bilingual copies of the present agreement have been signed, both of them having the same legal validity in French and English.
